Projects	<p>Cruach Mhor repowering:</p> <p>Consultation – 26th October 1430 Glen Hall. Updates will be given by CMWFT, CGDT (re Cowal Community Energy (CCE) and Community Energy Scotland (CES)) and Community Council followed by a risk presentation by Alasdair Macleod. There will be a future date for presentation by CCE to answer further questions from the community. Decision has not yet been taken on how to gather community opinions thereafter.</p> <p>Warmer ColGlen II update:</p> <p>Referrals from households are becoming fewer but the odd one still coming in. Smart meter coverage for households with solar PV is being looked into by AliEnergy as payments for exports can't be made because of connectivity. Mobile signal may be possible. Follow-up visits to involved households are the main activity to support vulnerable. Contracts have been extended to end December with possibility of extension to end February 2026 if funding is available. RM was thanked for her service to the community.</p> <p>Connect Glendaruel and Food Resilience Project:</p> <p>RM presented background to the combined project and how costs were arrived at.</p> <p>EV charger installation can go ahead without planning permission.</p> <p>Tasks to action at a stand-alone steering group.
